

Helpful Hints for Year 13

Autumn Term:

- Student 'Leavers' meeting will take place to ensure
 - 1. Any initiated transition plan is on track or initiate transition plan if not already started.
 - 2. Begin post 18 provision application process if not already done so.
 - 3. Transition Social Worker should attend this meeting to offer further input and guidance.
 - 4. Transitions Nurse should also attend to offer health related advice, support and ensure Leaver's medicals are initiated.

Spring / Summer Term.

- School, Home and Transitions Team (Social Worker, Nurse Etc) to work together to.
 - 1. Ensure any agreed transition plan is on track.
 - 2. Liaise with relevant professionals to ensure any pre-entry assessment process has taken place.
 - 3. Arrange taster days and or visits
