What Does a School Governor Do?

- -The key role of our governing body is to both support and challenge Mrs. Wigley and the staff to ensure our children receive the best possible education.
- -we constantly ask challenging questions and monitor the school's progress towards meeting agreed targets.
- -we are responsible for managing the schools budget and try to ensure we get the best value for our money.
- -we help school to carry out honest evaluations of itself, so that we are always striving to improve and are not just content with our excellent achievements to date.

When do the Govenors meet?

The full governing body meets once a term.

There are two committees within the governing body – the **PUPILS, CURRICULUM AND STRATEGIC PLANNING** committee and **FINANCE**, **PERSONNEL AND GENERAL PURPOSE** committee each with its own chair. Governors are allocated to one of these according to their skills and interests. These committees meet once a term, just prior to the full governing body meeting where they feedback. Thank You to Residential Staff

A questionnaire was sent out to parents following the last programme of residential visits.

One of the biggest returns ever recorded was received with an overwhelming response that the visits were of huge benefit. Parents felt they provided the opportunity for challenge, independence, spending time with friends and had a huge impact on families, allowing respite in the knowledge that their child was being well cared for.

The governing body would like to say a big thank you to all the wonderful staff who give their time voluntarily to enable these visits to take place. The questionnaire results make it clear their hard work is much appreciated by students and parents

A questionnaire was also given to staff who were also very much in favour of the visits taking place. They offered some suggestions to offset the impact of staff absent from school and also to help to alleviate the tiredness due to lack of sleep whilst on the residentials.

Their suggestions are being discussed by the schools Health and Wellbeing committee and the governing body is very supportive of any measures to improve the experience for all the staff.



Ash Lea School's involvement with 'Inspiring Leaders'

All lead schools have a proven track record of outstanding leadership and the development and delivery of outstanding leadership programmes. Ash Lea delivers leadership courses at three different levels:

- Level 1 National professional qualification in middle leadership (NPQML)
- Level 2 National professional qualification in senior leadership (NPQSL)
- Level 3 National professional qualification for headship (NPQH)

We passionately believe that great school leadership has the power to transform children's lives and we are therefore committed to provide the best possible learning opportunities to all of our participants.


Ash Lea felt it wanted to be part of this exciting initiative to ensure quality continuing professional development for its own staff but also to support the other leaders in their understanding of the needs of children and young people with special needs.

Our involvement in this company also brings income in to the school which is targeted at continued professional development of our own staff.

Ash Lea Trust Fund

Did you know that governors also act as Trustees for the school Trust Fund? After each termly meeting of the full governing body, we discuss the accounts, review donations and fundraising activities, and agree how to spend the money available. In the current financial year (since April 2013) the fund has purchased a wide range of equipment including books, iPads/cases and apps, iTobii eye gaze computers, outdoor tables and bikes, and sensory processing equipment, to the tune of £17,000. It has also supported the very successful Fun week (£10,000) and residential trips (£15,000). We already encourage and receive regular requests for funding from staff and pupils via the school council, but it would be great to hear from parents with YOUR IDEAS on how best these funds can be spent for the benefit of pupils and to enrich the life of Ash Lea School.





Teaching school

Ash Lea School is also a strategic partner in Candleby Lane 'Teaching School'. Teaching schools give outstanding schools a leading role in the training and professional development of teachers, support staff and head teachers, as well as contributing to the raising of standards through school-to-school support.



Schools work together within a teaching school alliance – a group of schools and other partners that are supported by the leadership of a teaching school. This will include all those schools that benefit by receiving support, as well as strategic partners that will lead on certain aspects of delivery. A school can choose to be involved in more than one alliance and a school could be a strategic partner for more than one teaching school.

Strategic partners are schools, universities and others (that could include the academy chains, private sector, diocese or local authorities) that deliver particular aspects of the alliance's activity such as ITT, continuing professional development (CPD), leadership development or school-to-school support.

Ash Lea School leads on developing special educational needs provision across the alliance and training. We run a support group for special educational needs co-coordinators (SenCo's) and deliver appropriate training. We also involved in the delivering and training initial teacher training.
