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










looking at the Christmas decorations

We have prepared the ground, planted seeds, harvested vegetables and made delicious soups in the Dig for Victory campaign. We have followed the story of William Beech and his evacuation to the countryside with Mr Tom in our story. We survived air raids in the city and helped boost morale with our singing and music. After the war we got into the Christmas spirit. We decorated our tree, made cards and baked gingerbread Christmas trees. We also went ice skating in Nottingham and had an amazing Christmas Dinner!
