There are two ASDAN life skill challenges linked to this activity – Using Textiles to Create a Collage (page 4-5) and Experiencing a Multi-sensory Environment (page 6-7). Choose the one that is most suited to your child's needs and ability.

- Have a look around the house for different textiles with different textures and different colours this could be different materials you have, items of clothing, rugs, cloths, cushions, blankets etc.
- Take time to feel the different textures on different parts of the body. Questions - Do they like the feel? How does it feel? Can use the symbols provided to help.
- There are three ways in which the collage can be created:
 - You can use the different textiles you found and place them on the ground/table to create a big collage inside or outside - think back to Art Attack when Neil Buchanan did his big art (google it if you are unsure about what I am talking about).
 - 2. You can use the textiles found to cut and stick onto a piece of card. This is if you don't mind the material being cut up and stuck down.
 - 3. You can have a go at sewing the pieces of materials together this could be a combination of sewing and gluing.


