This term we are focusing on popular culture. The children completed worksheets which showed their favourite to programme, book, film, foods and music. Using these we have focussed each week around their choices. This week we are looking at favourite book/film characters. | Tuesday Reading | Read Chapter 1 of Harry Potter and the Philosopher Stone. Child can read alone or be read to. Try to encourage them to read as must as possible, sound out tricky words or recognise the initial sounds of words. | |

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| Wednesday Practical Literacy | Choose your favourite character from a film or book that you like. Make a finger puppet of your favourite character. You could make it out of paper, junk modelling using any recycling you have or fabric, whatever you have readily available at home. If you choose to make it out of fabric/felt you could sew it together. We have practiced sewing at school previously. | Wednesday Numeracy | To be able to order the days of the week, months of the year and days in a month. Use the symbols provided, or make your own, you can even just write them out and cut them up. Children to order independently, reading the words as they order them. You could match events that happen in each month to the words. When is everyone's birthday? You could use the symbols to make your own calendar. | |
| Thursday Writing | Write a character description about the character you have made. Describe how you made it and why you chose different colours/styles/textures. Try to use adjectives in your description. Some have been highlighted below in the example. For example: | |
| | The big bad wolf has brown fur, sharp, white teeth, black eyes and vicious claws. His big, pointed ears allow him to hear the pigs when they are far away. | |

| | The three little pigs and <mark>short and round.</mark> They have big, wet noses and a curly, pink tail. | |
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| | I made the three little pigs and the big bad wolf. I used paper to make my finger puppets. I cut circles out of paper and coloured them in pink to make the pigs. I made sure that the wolf had long pointy ears so that he could hear the pigs better. | |
| | Encourage children to work as independently as possible. For some children it might be useful to come up with the sentences together. You could write the sentences down, cut them into separate words and then the child can reorder them. | |
| Thursday Numeracy | Sequence what you do in your day. You can use the symbols provided or just write down your daily routine. Maybe you do things on different days? You could attend a sports club? You could even write a journal for what you have done this week? Make sure it is in the right order. | |
| | For example: Wake up – have a shower – brush teeth – get dressed – eat breakfast – go in the car to school – spend the day at school – go in the car home – have dinner – watch TV – go to bed. | |
