GROUP: Hawthorn W/C: 25.01.2021 Topic: Pop Culture

This term we are focusing on popular culture. The children completed worksheets which showed their favourite to programme, book, film, foods and music. Using these we have focussed each week around their choices. This week we are looking at favourite book/film characters. They can choose their own book/film character to work on this week, or do a variety of characters. 	Disguise your favourite animal character using shadows.	Black/grey
	Pick your favourite animal toys and use a light/torch/sunshine to make a shadow of them onto white or black	pencil

Friday Life Skills	Role Play – Laundrette: how to wash their clothes and peg them out. (Set up a laundrette environment if possible).

Checking how much/ where to put the soap. Setting dial(s) correctly looking at numbers/symbols/words (or scrubbing/rinsing clothing correctly in tub). Making sure that the clothes have no suds left in. Pegging them outside. Checking if dry. Folding and putting away.
