Covid Information

We will continue with our additional cleaning and ensuring that pupils are washing their hands well and that our classroom spaces are well-ventilated. Whilst it is for test and trace to get in touch if your child is a close contact, practically, we know that this is either not happening, or not happening swiftly. Therefore, when we know about a confirmed case and we know that your child is a close contact we will inform you. If there is an outbreak (this is more than 2 cases within 10 days within a group) then the school will put its contingency plan in place and return to bubbles and increased mask wearing.


