Pupils in receipt of PP and PP+ currently make progress in line with the rest of the school. There is no difference between the average attendance of this group of pupils and others. In order to continue this, we must ensure:

### **Teaching Priorities**

All teachers and support staff have access to quality training which provides them with the knowledge to ensure the delivery of outstanding teaching.

### **Targeted Academic Support**

All pupils have access to the curriculum content and resources that offer the opportunity to make outstanding progress in their individual targets.

### **Wider Strategies**

All pupils have the option to access wider school opportunities including residential experiences, community trips and cultural events.

### **Pupil Premium Spending**

Ash Lea uses a tiered approach to pupil premium spending based on principles suggested by the EEF (Educational Endowment Fund). This ensures that the funding ensures effective teaching, targeted support to maintain good progress by pupils and ensuring that non-academic barriers are addressed and pupils given opportunities to support behaviour, and social and emotional support.
