Review: last year's aims and outcomes

Aim	Outcome
All pupils continue to make at least good progress in their Individual Education Plan	Pupils have been supported with resources required to meet IEP targets. This has included ICT equipment, communication support and additional staff for offsite activities. 93.5% of pupils made good or better progress in their IEP targets. Overall pupils have made good or better progress in 83% of their targets.
All pupils have the individual resources needed to access the curriculum	
All pupils have their individual needs met by all teaching staff	
Continue to improve behaviour and mental well-being of all pupils	Pupil behaviour continues to improve overall with a reduction in the severity of incidents across the school year. Pre-formal pupils made an average of 8.6 points, and Semi-formal pupil 12 points in the Ash Lea Steps, Personal, Social and Emotional development.

Aim	Outcome
All pupils are able to access extra-curricular activities and residential visits (where appropriate)	16 pupils in receipt of PP are attending a residential visit this year for 3-5 days. For some this will be their first time away from home. Due to Artis being unable to provide the agreed provision, the funding was used to support creative opportunities across school. This included 3 themed arts weeks offering every pupil a live theatre experience, music concerts, workshops, and art activities. The school continue to work towards Artsmark Award.
