It was wonderful to see so many of you at recent events; leavers presentation, family BBQ and sports day. Thank you, as ever, for brilliant support and enthusiasm in celebrating all our pupils' achievements.

We will be saying a sad farewell to several members of staff at the end of this term. Emma Bottomley, teacher in Cherry class will be fulfilling her long held ambition of travelling the world and will be venturing as far as the far east and Australia. Ariana Skillington will also be pursuing her ambition of following a different career path by undertaking a degree in occupational therapy after very many years of service to the school. Rebecca Biddles from the admin team is pursuing a new career path supporting pupils in a pastoral capacity at a local secondary school. TA Jess Ali is leaving to focus on growing her therapeutic music support business. Katie Walker and Sinead Price have left to pursue careers in social care. As part of our process of redeployment due to budgetary challenges, several of our midday support assistants will be leaving us, many having secured new posts elsewhere. Sarah Vearnals, Ian Savage, Zara Mehoy, Tim Rudd, Sally Bailey and Michelle Northey will be leaving the team. We wish them all very well. Others, Liz Gaughan, Sarah Fletcher-Whitmarsh, Dawn Green, Natalie Meek, Alithia Lane, Pauline Atkinson, Debbie Burnett and Becky Lane have secured personal care assistant posts in the school and Donna McLean will be leading the PCA team. We also warmly welcome new staff members; Suki Chan who is our new receptionist following Kelly Ginley's promotion and TA Ashton Veevers, who will be supporting a pupil to transition to the school.

The school has had to make difficult choices financially given the increases in teacher and support staff salaries, which are not completely funded by the government. As staff have left over the past term, we have not replaced them and we have removed the MDSA roles within the school, replacing with personal care assistant posts. This is a huge challenge to special schools nationally and we are speaking to our MP and are part of the National Network of Specialist Provision who are talking to the Department for Education about these challenges.

We will continue to use money the school has put aside for essential improvements to the older part of the building and most of this work will be completed over the summer and October break. This work will improve the provision for pupils in Cherry class, expand the administrative provision and offer a quality 'hybrid' meeting space for families and professionals. Due to the real success of our forest school and music therapy provision this year, we have secured funding for this provision for another year and have expanded the forest school leader cohort with Gilly Lavis joining the team.

Have a wonderful summer break with friends and family. We look forwards to seeing the pupils back on the 6th of September!
