Aim	Outcome
	Pre-formal pupils made an average of 8.6 points, and Semi-formal pupil 12 points progress in the Ash Lea Steps, Personal, Social and Emotional development.
	70.97% of pupils in receipt of pupil premium are accessing additional activities to support their mental health and wellbeing including ELSA, Therapy Animals, Forest School, Music Therapy and Sensory Integration Support.
All pupils can access activities that increase cultural capital and residential visits (where appropriate)	All PP pupils at the end of a key stage were able to access a school residential. All PP pupils have been able to access trips throughout this year including London, Leicester, and more local facilities. This has included Art Galleries and Theatre Trips.
