## Message from the Headteacher

We have had to say a sad farewell to Rachel Cousins who was our lead health care assistant who has been with us for four years. We're incredibly pleased that one of our health care assistants, Jo Kench will be replacing Rachel and will become a familiar contact for parents around medication and other health needs. Jo has developed her skills, knowledge and confidence during her time as a health care assistant in Rowan and Maple and will be a areal asset to the school and its pupils. Whilst our focus is on supporting our pupils to develop, it's also such a pleasure to see our staff team do so too. A huge thank you to HCA Karen Sedgewick who has stepped up with such professionalism to oversee so many aspects of the health care provision in Rachel's absence for our pupils.

Our communication team have been developing the school's use of signing across the school. Becky Bidmead and Tasha Mills have been leading on our 'sing and sign' sessions, when we use targeted support for pupils who are developing their signing and communication, as well as those pupils who use communication devices (books, eye gaze or iPads). These sessions focus on core words (useful words for general use). Using the medium of songs and music, the pupils get to practise their signing. Next term the team will support everyone's signing confidence through a sign of the week as well as topic themed signs. You will be able to watch Tash and Becky sign on our website very soon!

Over the past year and more, the school has been reviewing and revising its curriculum, we will be sharing the impact of this work and the changes that have been put into place in the summer and autumn terms with parents and carers and finding out what you think about the amendments that we have made.

As part of careers week this term we held our Life After Ash Lea fair for pupils to meet and explore providers who they may choose to engage with in the future. This included Cotgrave Community Kitchen, The Adventure Services and Mencap. We have also had pupils access work experience both in and out of school, with two more placements planned over the summer term. Our leavers have also been visiting their new placements for next year, with visits from colleges planned for the summer term in school for pupils and parents to find out more about what they offer. More information for this will follow.

Over the next year we will be increasing the diversity of school events and our curriculum reflect better our school community. We will be sending out a survey to find out more from our families and welcome your responses.

The building work in Cherry class, in reception and our administrative areas will continue this Easter break. Working on such an old building has been more complex than our contractors had expected but hope that by the June half term break we will be finished! We will then be able to complete the furnishing and decoration of these areas.
